## THINGS TO COME | GOD'S SOVEREIGNTY & JOHN'S ASSIGNMENTS REVELATION 10:1-11

God's angelic messengers sounded six trumpets. Two of the three woes announced by the bird of prey will have taken place at this time. Now there is an interlude. Revelation includes several breaks amid judgement. We saw one between the opening of the sixth and seventh seal, and we see another between the sixth and seventh trumpet. These interludes remind us that God is still in control. They also give us a moment to catch our breath while reading of horrifying judgments. In chapter ten, we see God send a messenger to John. The message reminds us that God is in control and John receives three assignments. What are John's assignments and what can we imply from them?
