

OLD AND NEW | THE SIGNIFICANCE OF CHRIST
LUKE 2:1-11 & VARIOUS PASSAGES

When Jesus Christ was born over 2,000 years ago, thousands of years of Old Testament prophecy was fulfilled. When we celebrate Christmas, we celebrate the most significant birth in all of history. Luke's Gospel in the New Testament sheds light on the prophetic fulfillment of the Old Testament when the angels announced to simple shepherds to not fear, because they brought Good News: "For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord." Jesus came to save us from our sin. He also brings relief to two of our greatest struggles: insignificance and isolation. On Christmas Eve day we will look on how Jesus saved us from sin. Next week, we will look at how He is the answer to isolation and discouragement, and today we will look at how He brings about significance and worth like no other.
