A king should be received with greatness and honor, especially a great king. However, in John's Gospel, John wrote a heart wrenching truth about Jesus' time on earth: "11 He came to his own, and his own people did not receive him." (John 1:11, ESV) Matthew clearly wrote about Jesus's authority, identity, and priorities in the beginning of Matthew 9. Matthew was called by Jesus early in this chapter and he reacted to Christ as a King and therefore followed Him. Jesus preached the gospel of the kingdom throughout Israel, even though Israel as a nation would reject Him.
